### COVID-19 Safe Plan ASPA Education Programs

This plan outlines the revised or additional health and safety measures that the Australian School of Performing Arts will implement to help meet government regulations, mitigate the risk of COVID-19 transmission and ensure that all participants, families, visitors and ASPA staff members have a safe place to sing, dance and work in. We appreciate your cooperation in following these guidelines when attending ASPA Education programs and events.

#### Arrivals and Dismissals

- An ASPA staff member will stand at the designated venue entrance to monitor arrivals and dismissals. Please follow the directions of our staff.
- Please only arrive 5 minutes before your scheduled program time and ensure you are on time for collection at the designated point. Parents are unable to wait on site during session times.

#### Attendance

- Please ensure you and your child are in good health before attending programs. If you or your child are displaying COVID-19 symptoms, please do not attend the program until you are better.
- Should an ASPA staff member test positive for COVID-19 they will not return to work until after their isolation period is complete and they are asymptomatic.

#### Masks and Respiratory Hygiene

- Our staff will comply with each individual school's COVID-Safe policy.
- We welcome any participant to wear a mask to ASPA Education programs if that is your family's choice.
- All ASPA staff have undertaken the Australian Government's online Infection Control Training and been briefed on our COVID-Safe Plan and their additional responsibilities.
- Participants will be reminded to cough into their elbows or a tissue and place used tissues straight into the bin then wash their hands or use the hand sanitation station.
